Dogs run and romp at the Canine Corps Dog Sanctuary. We have both indoor and outdoor playgrounds complete with tunnels, ramps, and a potty area. While you are away, a trained Kennel Technician will supervise your pets. A smaller, fenced area is available for smaller dogs. Outdoor areas for playing are available, weather permitting, with trails bordering the property.

All dogs must pass a temperament evaluation and be current with Maryland required vaccines. All dogs on the property must be spayed or neutered.

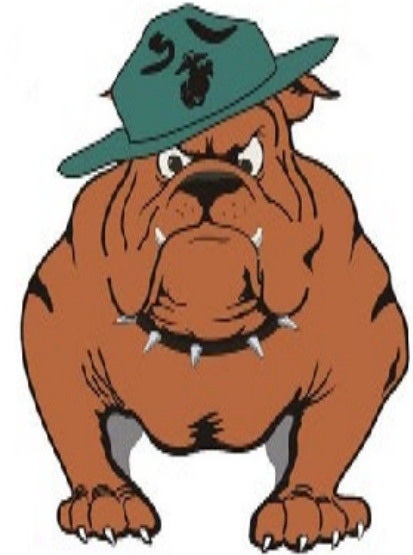

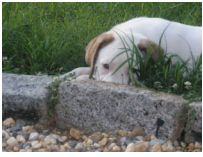

We provide our services to the Maryland Reserve Units and National Guard Units that deploy overseas, as well as temporary housing for local military families that are moving to the next duty station. Canine Corps provides a place for them to take their 4 legged family members for a less stressful environment while they are “packing out” and staying at whatever non-animal friendly hotel they are assigned to.
